### Who Can Sign Up?

School-Wide Recitals are open to all current FSPA Music & Theatre students, regardless of age or skill level. This includes adult students and beginners.

Theatre monologues and short scenes are welcome.

Ensembles, Duets & Trios are welcome as long as all are FSPA students.

Students are welcome to have a faculty accompanist with their piece. Ask your instructor about how to hire an accompanist.

Due to the flooring available in the spaces the recitals are held in, dance pieces cannot be accepted.

### Requirements for Sign Up

Solo/Duet pieces cannot exceed 3 minutes, 30 seconds in length. Students may play more than one piece, but total time of performance cannot exceed this time limit. This includes playing in more than one discipline (example: a piano piece and vocal piece).

Ensembles/Trios may perform more than one piece but the total length of performance cannot exceed 6 minutes.

### What to Expect

After signing up, you will receive an e-mail several days ahead of the recital alerting you if your submission was accepted. The email will also give day of performances details including performance order, call time, and location information.

Signing up does not guarantee a performance spot. Space & time limitations and other factors may preclude all students who sign up being on a particular recital. In these circumstances, preferences will be given to students who have never played a School-Wide Recital before, students who have not played one recently, and students who signed up the earliest.

If you are not given a performance spot for a recital, you will be guaranteed a spot on the next recital (or later recital of your choice).

School-Wide recitals are more informal than other FSPA performances, however you are welcome to dress up if you'd like. Family and Friends are welcomed and encouraged to attend.

Students are asked to be seated in the audience 10 minutes before the performance begins. Programs with performance order will be available and students are asked to come to front of the room/stage once there are two students ahead of them on the program. After you perform, we request that you return to the audience and you and any guests remain to support the other students until the end of the recital.
